Message from Mrs McGuigan

We have reached the end of another 'unusual' half term – school was partially closed with most children engaging with remote learning, and we have ended with almost all children back in school and back to learning the traditional way in the classroom!

The return to school has been very successful with high attendance which is great news and testament to the hard work of our families and school staff. I have spoken with many children across all year groups who tell me they are really pleased to be back at school. They tell me the things they missed the most were their friends and the support of the adults that work in our school. They have said many positive things about the way in which we kept in touch with them and the remote learning, but that they much prefer to be able to learn at school, face to face. I am glad to hear this as we do too!

From 29th March, when schools in Hertfordshire have broken up for the Easter holidays, outdoor gatherings (including in private gardens) of either 6 people (the Rule of 6) or 2 households will also be allowed, making it easier for friends and families to meet outside. This is a positive step forward in the government's roadmap but I remind parents that the evidence shows that it is safer for people to meet outdoors and the rules do not allow us to meet indoors. I am hopeful that the weather will be kind to us over the Easter holidays so we can enjoy time with our friends and family but urge parents to continue to be sensible and follow the rules.

As a school we will be moving to larger 'bubbles' after the Easter holidays and instead of class 'bubbles' we will have year group bubbles. This will enable staff to be shared between classes when need-

ing additional support as well as larger zones on the playground and more children to choose to play with! We feel confident that this is the right time to do this as we continue to work towards a return to normal.

We appreciate that it can be hard to find child care as we are all parents but the more people we have to help out, the more the workload gets shared reducing the amount of child care required


