The Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) has published a <u>coronavirus (COVID-19) support quide for schools</u> with evidence-based approaches to catch up for all students. Schools should use this document to help them direct their additional funding in the most effective way. This could include, for example: small group or one-to-one tuition (particularly through the National Tutoring Programme)
