We thought that the skipping workshop was the most fun. We liked doing the figure of eight. We couldn't skip before but now we can. We learnt how to do scissors and double dutch.



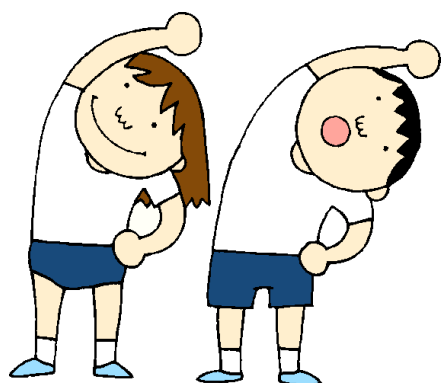
