Learning across the school



Year 6 have been creating paintings considering perspective. They have also been researching and writing about inspirational leaders of colour, some of the leaders included Frida Kahlo, Chadwick Boseman, Martin Luther King, Rosa Parks and Barrack Obama.





Year 5 have been experiencing different types of print and have produced lino prints linked to the artist Henri Rousseau they then discussed and evaluated their own work and that of others in.

They have also been learning about the parts of a flower in their science lessons– a great opportunity to learn new scientific vocabulary!
