We have recently celebrated diversity in school by taking part in National Neurodiversity week for the second year. Children have access to a wide range of books in the school library that include characters with neurodiverse characteristics. The aim of introducing these books is to raise children's awareness of challenges others may face but also to celebrate and recognise differences. Children are really enjoying these books and many have commented on being able to "see myself in the book".

We have a few new displays in our school entrance this half term. One display clearly outlines our six school values seen as green jigsaw pieces and our school six Rs as behaviours for learning on blue jigsaw Children Flourish pieces. Each week a new school value and six R

are chosen as a focus and assemblies are built around.



The children can now describe how recipes can be adapted to change the appearance, taste, texture and aroma. Apparently the bread with chocolate chip cookies was the best!

We had to leave the dough to grow over play-time as the yeast we added makes this happen. We then baked it and the bread tased really yummy!
